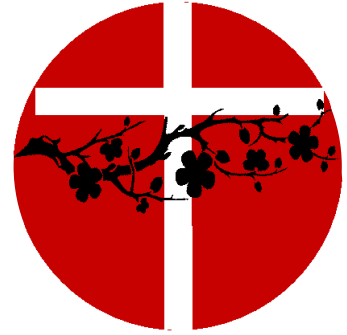

Thank you all for your tender prayers. We would like to praise the Lord for the meetings that we have had this first quarter of 2026.

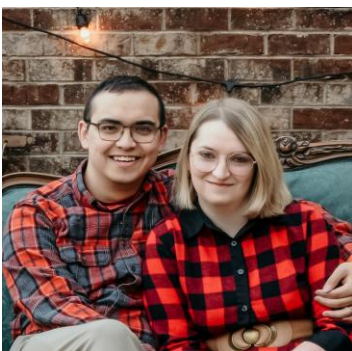

However, there are some exceptions. Paul had a desire to go to Rome but it took quite a few years before he got there. God has been reminding me that He does still want us to be in Japan, but for His own reasoning, not yet. God placed Paul’s desire to go to Rome to emphasize the harmony between being patient and faithful. Paul expressed his desire to be in Rome and to minister there, but God allowed many different obstacles to delay and keep Paul from reaching Rome until He wanted Paul to get there. Paul was faithful to the burden God placed on his heart, but he was also patient to know that God would get him there in His own timing.

Our mission board President Ben Sinclair told me recently that God is preparing Japan for something big. He noticed that there as been an increase of missionaries that are called to Japan.
